We are back playing at last!

It was no secret, at the time of the last HOWZAT! Newsletter, we had no clue as to when the season would begin. Despite allowing other non-contact sports to start, the Government, in particular Boris Johnson, were insisting cricket was still not possible to be played safely, even going as far as describing the cricket ball as a 'vector of disease'!

As late as 3rd July, Boris was on LBC News in the morning saying there were still issues with the playing of cricket including teas and the use of pavilions. The ECB were understandably livid at this. Weeks of work had culminated in the latest ECB recommendations to the Department of Media, Culture & Sport including the banning of teas and use of pavilions for anything other than use of toilets!

Someone must have taken Boris for a great lunch the very same day, (including copious amounts of fine wine and port!) because, during his Covid-19 Briefing that evening, Boris then declared that the advice was that cricket COULD safely re-start and that recreational cricket would be allowed from Saturday 18th July.

Panic then set in! Although we were prepared, two weeks didn't seem long enough to get everything organised.

The new Tees Herts & Essex Border League (HEBL) Management Committee met (virtually) the following Monday and recommended that the league season start from the half-way point with the first two games being tagged on to the end of the season in September.

The HEBL clubs then met (virtually) the following day to agree these terms. Only two clubs declared that the Covid restrictions set by the ECB were too onerous and that they would not play any cricket in 2020!

Our Sunday fixtures from 19th July, already in the diary, were very quickly confirmed and we were all set. Even the Boardmans Davies Cup and The Cricketer National Village Cup found ways to make their competitions happen. We entered them both.

Excitement in the club was immense and lots of people declared their intent to play. We've had players return to the club and a new member join. All very encouraging.

The season began with a very encouraging win over 2019 HECL Champions Nazeing Common. Even more encouraging was the fact that our two top scorers on the day were teenagers Olly Hartnell and William Cutlan-Smyth. Excellent signs for the future.

The day after we recorded a fine 3 wicket victory over Netteswell & Burnt Mill. The star of that game was another 16-year old, Max Smith with a match winning 30 not out.

Last week, the weather was not on our side. Our planned Saturday match against neighbours Hatfield Heath was postponed and West Bergholt CC answered our plea for a game. The match reached it's half-way point before rain spoiled the day.

Last Sunday, Chrishall CC were our opponents and again the juniors were at the forefront of our win. Only 2 of our 221 runs were scored by players over the age of 16. And 1 of those was scored by debutant Dad Richard Porter!!

The remaining fixtures can be seen on the next page. There are a few highlights to point out, in particular this Sunday 2nd August when we have selected two Sunday XIs. We think this is possibly the first time in the club's history that we've been able to field two teams on a Sunday. It was only two years ago we could manage one!

This position has occurred due to The Cricketer National Village Cup match away at Horndon-on-the-Hill, a team we met many years ago in the same tournament.

We were keen not to let Tillingham, our other Sunday opponents, down. We had a very enjoyable match against them last year and we are looking forward not only to them visiting us again, but to our trip to them later in September.

We look forward to seeing as many as possible supporting our teams, but please observe the social distancing and hygiene guidance when visiting the club.

Former England international and Essex star Owais Shah has been passing on some top tips to our clutch of talented youngsters.

Development of junior cricketers has been a feature of our club for a number of years and under-16s now feature heavily in our senior sides.

All the teenagers are set to develop their skills even further thanks to the training sessions under the watchful eye of Owais. He's also offering 1 to 1 sessions for both juniors and seniors.

The former Essex and Middlesex middle-order batsman,

who also bowled off-spin, represented England in six Tests, 71 one-day internationals and 17 T20 internationals between 2001 and 2009.

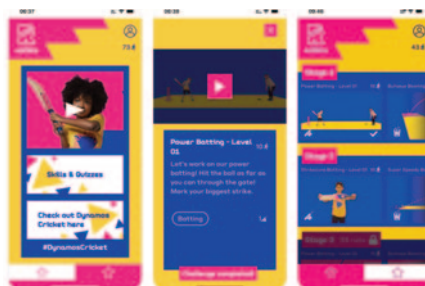

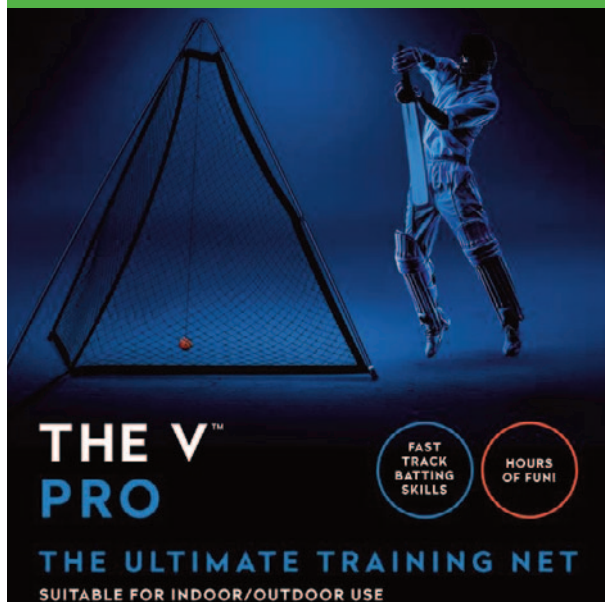

A safe return to recreational cricket – July

The guidance we receive on how and when to restart cricket activities changes on a daily basis. As the lock-down begins to loosen, the latest news is highlighted in the image below.

PLAN FOR SOCIALLY DISTANCED CRICKET MATCHES IN ENGLAND



Undergo a personal symptom check at home prior to matches. Stay at home and do not take part if you demonstrate any COVID-19 symptoms



Use own equipment throughout where possible and clean bat when leaving field of play



No sweat or saliva is to be applied to the ball at any time. Hands and the ball should be cleaned at all breaks in play and every 6 overs



Players to remain socially distanced at all times (wicket keepers and slip fielders at 1m+)



Use of the clubhouse, changing rooms and toilets should adhere to the latest UK Government advice



Keep a record of all those in attendance at each session, including contact details



Social distancing should be maintained during wicket celebrations and drinks breaks



Batters are to run in distinct marked running lines to ensure they are not within 2m of the bowler or other batter

Groups limited to a maximum of 30 participants, including coaches and officials

Until we are allowed a full and open return to cricket, the following guidance should be followed by players, volunteers, spectators, parents and visitors to Matching Green Cricket Club

COVID-19 PLAN FOR JUNIOR & OPEN-AGE CRICKET

APPLICABLE TO PLAYERS, VOLUNTEERS, SPECTATORS, PARENTS, CLUBS, COACHES & OFFICIALS IN ENGLAND



This document provides measures that should be taken by players, clubs, and officials before, during and after all cricket activity. The document should be read in conjunction with latest UK Government guidance and if required, the full ECB Return to Cricket Plan for Step 4.

For all activity, UK Government social distancing guidance should be adhered to at all times. This document refers to current **plan for England** and could change in response to the current COVID-19 Alert Level or other UK Government advice.



BEFORE ACTIVITY

- Check for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are symptomatic and/or living in a household with a possible COVID-19 infection you should remain at home and follow UK Government guidance.
- Follow UK Government guidance on shielding and protecting people who are clinically extremely vulnerable from COVID-19 if it applies to you.
- Personal hygiene measures should be carried out at home before and after cricket activity.
- Bring your own hand sanitiser where possible and practice strong hand hygiene at all times.
- Follow UK Government guidance on public transport or car sharing.
- Use of the clubhouse, changing rooms and toilets should adhere to the latest UK Government advice.
- For advice on reducing the risk of infection when outside your home please visit the 'Staying Safe Outside Your Home' pages on gov.uk.
- Club representatives should ensure that the facility is compliant with current UK Government legislation including legislation and guidance related to COVID-19. A risk assessment should have been completed and risk mitigation measures put in place and monitored.
- During all cricket, an attendance register is required with which includes contact details for contact tracing if required.
- Any participants who have been asked to isolate by NHS Test and Trace must not exercise outside of their own home or garden and must not exercise with others.
- Clubs should strictly limit the time spent congregating at a venue before activity begins. Meet-up times should reflect this. Participants should arrive changed and ready to begin if possible.



DURING ACTIVITY

- Groups limited to a maximum of 30 participants, including coaches and/or officials.
 - Participants enter the site and prepare whilst maintaining social distancing.
 - Limit the sharing of equipment, but if you do share, practise strict hand hygiene.
 - No sweat or saliva is to be applied to the ball at any time.
 - Hand sanitizer to be used at all breaks in activity and prior to any food or drinks.
 - Cricket activity must take place outdoors only.
- Additional advice for match-play:**
- Players to remain socially distanced at all times (wicket keepers & slip fielders at 1m+).
 - Umpires are not to handle the ball at any point of the game, leaving it at the stumps during breaks.
 - Batters to clean their bat when leaving the field of play.
 - A 'hygiene break' should take place every six overs or every 20 minutes and should include hand sanitisation and the cleaning of the ball.
 - Bowlers should not hand anything to the umpire.
 - Only one official allowed inside the scorers' box.
 - Social distancing must always be maintained including during celebrations and breaks.
 - The ball must be immediately returned to the bowler, not passed between players.
 - Batters are to run in distinct running lines to ensure they are not within 2m of the bowler or other batter. Lanes to be marked on the square.
 - In line with current UK Government guidance, clubs should not prepare food for participants. Individuals should bring their own food and drink for 'teas' or practice. Water bottles or other refreshment containers should not be shared.



AFTER ACTIVITY

- Participants should exit whilst maintaining social distancing.
- Social gathering after the activity is allowed in line with current UK Government guidelines on hospitality.
- One club representative/volunteer should be responsible for collecting and disinfecting shared equipment.
- Regular cleaning of equipment and the facility should take place, particularly between one group finishing, and the next group starting.
- Clubs should encourage all participants to report any infection of their household to the NHS Test and Trace system following use of the facility to limit the spread of the virus.

Above all, please stay safe!

The opportunities for people to take the first stage of the ECB's umpiring course is fantastic and I'm sure it will be chance to come and see if the umpire was actually correct! The online umpires course is open to anyone who would like to take an interest in the role on whatever level, and you never know what it may lead to in the future."

- Upskill those players who may usually be expected to stand in games with no official umpires
