## **1 GUIDELINES**

- 1) Please ensure you have a copy of the full / up to date register of all your Juniors' names, addresses, any medical conditions and telephone contact numbers in case of fire, accidents or emergencies.
- 2) Please take this register at the start of each session.
- 3) Please ensure that you contact parents in the event that a Junior has to be taken to seek medical attention, or has been given medical attention on site. At the time of the medical attention please make a note of the date, time and nature of the injury and the treatment given and complete an incident report form. Send a copy to the Juniors Cricket Manager and Safe Guarding Officer.
- 4) The club will provide a basic first - aid pack. Please ensure that this is kept in your kit bag at all times and that it is replenished as necessary.
- 5) Please ensure that you do not leave any Juniors unsupervised at the end of training sessions or matches. Two adults should be present at these times (for everybody's protection).
- 6) Please ensure you do not drive one child (other than family) in your car alone unless prior written permission has been received (signed registration form) or in an emergency.
- 7) Please make sure all Juniors wear full protective equipment when facing a hard ball (particularly box and helmet). A helmet with faceguard must be worn at all times when batting or keeping wicket against a hard ball.
- 8) Please treat all Juniors equally, with respect and dignity.
- 9) Always put the welfare of each Junior first, before winning or achieving goals.
- 10) Recognise the developmental needs and capacity of each Junior, avoiding excessive training and not pushing him / her against their will.
- 11) Make cricket fun, enjoyable and ensure that fair play is promoted.
