#### **Code of Conduct**

Hutton Cricket Club is fully committed to safeguarding and promoting the well being of all its members. All members are encouraged to familiarise themselves with the code of conduct.

This Code of conduct applies to all matches played by the Club.

#### **Players**

- All members must play within the rules and respect officials and their decisions. Dissent will not be tolerated.
- All members must respect their opponents.
- Intimidation or aggressive behaviour towards opponents will not be tolerated.
- The welfare of any youth playing in an adult team takes priority.
- Members should keep to agreed timings for coaching practice and matches and inform their Coach / Team Manager if they are going to be late.
- Members must wear suitable kit as agreed with the Coach / Team Manager. Protective equipment, i.e. helmet, cricket box, gloves, pads and footwear are compulsory
- Players are expected to attend all training.
- The Club adopts a zero-tolerance policy of drug use.
- Captains and Team Managers are expected to exercise suitable control over their teams.

#### Parents / Carers

- Encourage your child to learn the rules and play within them at all times.
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials.
- Set a good example by recognising fair play and applauding the good performances of all.
- Do not coach from the sidelines.
- Never force your child to take part in sport.
- Never punish or belittle a child for losing or making mistakes.
- Publicly accept official's judgements.
- Support your child's involvement and help them to enjoy their sport.
- Encourage your child to show respect for all.
- Offer help as required.
- Refrain from leaving litter in and around the club.

Hutton Cricket Club aims to provide an open and inclusive environment. Discrimination of any kind will be not be tolerated.

Hutton Cricket Club accepts responsibility for the behaviour of its players, members and officials and will take disciplinary action against any individual that fails to comply with this Code of Conduct.

Any concerns should be raised with Team Managers or the Club Safeguarding Officer.







# YOUTH POLICIES

## Transport to matches and practice sessions

Hutton CC policy is that parents/guardians are responsible for transporting players to and from matches and practice sessions. The Club will not be registering private vehicles for the transportation of individuals in connection with any fixture or practice sessions. Parents/Guardians will need to arrange transportation and not simply deliver players to the club for travel to be arranged on their behalf. The implementation of this policy is not intended to exclude any player from participation and parents or carers should contact the relevant Coach/Team Manager if they have any problems with the transportation of players to matches or practice sessions.

## **Club Changing Policy**

For players under the age of 16 in adult teams the following policy applies:

- Young Players uncomfortable with changing or showering with adults are under no obligation to do so and are advised to change and shower at home
- Parental consent must be given if Young Players are to share changing facilities with adults
- If Young Players are sharing changing facilities with adults, parents have the option to supervise them whilst they are changing. The Club will make reasonable efforts to facilitate this.

## Permission for use of Photographs and recorded images

Hutton CC recognises the need to ensure the welfare and safety of all Young Players in cricket. Part of this commitment is that we will not permit photographs, video images or other images of Young Players to be taken or used without the consent of the Parent / Carer and the Young Player. Hutton CC follows the guidance issued in 'Safe Hands – Welfare of Young People in Cricket' on the use of images of Young Players which is available at <a href="http://www.ecb.co.uk/safehands">http://www.ecb.co.uk/safehands</a>. Hutton CC will take steps to ensure that these images are used solely for the purpose they are intended, which are the promotion and celebration of cricketing activities and the aid of coaching.

## Complaints and the reporting of Safeguarding Concerns

If a player, parent/carer, or volunteer has a concern about the welfare of a child, or the conduct of another child/young person or an adult (whether they are a parent, coach, member, or otherwise), these concerns should be brought to the attention of the Club Welfare Officer without delay. The person reporting the concern is not required to decide whether abuse has occurred, but simply has a duty to pass their concerns and any relevant information to the Welfare Officer. Contact details of the Welfare Officer can be found on the club website and on the noticeboard inside the main pavilion.





#### ENGLAND AND WALES CRICKET BOARD

## ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CODE

## INTRODUCTION

The England and Wales Cricket Board (the **ECB**) is responsible for the governance of cricket in England and Wales. This ECB Anti-Discrimination Code (the **Code**) is part of the ECB's continuing efforts to maintain the integrity, diversity and inclusivity of cricket.

The ECB aims to create an environment within cricket in England and Wales in which no individual, group or organisation experiences discrimination or acts in a discriminatory manner on the basis of a Protected Characteristic (as defined in the Equality Act 2020 from time to time – which at the time of writing are age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex or sexual orientation).

This Code therefore sets out discriminatory behaviour which, when carried out by a participant who is required to comply with it, will be a breach of the Code and may be sanctioned accordingly.

All Participants (as defined below) agree by virtue of their involvement in cricket in England and Wales to be bound by this Code and submit to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the relevant body which applies to them.

All County Cricket Boards, First Class Counties, the National Counties, leagues, clubs and other organisations under the jurisdiction of the ECB or its Members must adopt and enforce the Code.

Participants who are party to an ECB agreement and/or in receipt of ECB funding may be obliged, as a condition of those agreements or funding, to comply with or adopt the Code and/or enforce the provisions of the Code through their own processes.

The Code may be amended from time to time by the ECB in its sole discretion, with such amendments coming into effect on the date specified by the ECB.

## BREACHES UNDER THE ANTI-DISCRIMINATION CODE

## Cricket Organisation means

- (a) County Cricket Boards, First Class Counties, National Counties, the Marylebone Cricket Club and other organisations under the jurisdiction of the ECB or its Members;
- (b) clubs and leagues which are affiliated to or under the jurisdiction of either the ECB or any of its Members; and
- (c) any other organisations which adopt this Code.

## Participant means:

- (a) Cricket Organisations;
- (b) employees, directors, officers, committee members, contractors and volunteers, in each case, of the ECB or any Cricket Organisation;
- (c) match officials including members of the Association of Cricket Officials;

- (d) members of the ECB Coaches Association;
- (e) an individual taking part in a cricket match or event under the jurisdiction of the ECB and/or any ECB Member; and
- (f) any other individual who becomes bound by this Code.

## Example

Paragraph (f) above is intended to cover other individuals which a cricket organisation chooses to have bound by the Code. For example, a cricket venue may require spectators to abide by the Code by making it a provision of the ticket terms and conditions which a spectator agrees to.

- 1. It will be a breach of this Code for any Participant to:
  - 1.1. act in any manner, make any omission, or engage in any conduct, which does, or is likely to, offend, insult, humiliate, intimidate, threaten, disparage and/or vilify any person or group of people (acting reasonably), based on, or by reference to, any Protected Characteristic; and/or
  - 1.2. make any decision or any omission or do anything which might reasonably be deemed to discriminate against any person, or group of people, or to disadvantage that individual or group based on any Protected Characteristic unless permitted by law; and/or

in instances where the Participant is an organisation

- 1.3. fail to provide an effective, timely and proportionate response to an alleged breach under paragraphs 1.1 and/or 1.2 above, carried out by any individual or organisation under the jurisdiction of the Participant.
- 2. The breaches referenced in paragraph 1 shall apply regardless of whether the Protected Characteristic(s) around which the breach is based applies to the person or people to whom the offending conduct is directed.

# Example

If a player makes a homophobic comment directed at another player during a match, regardless of whether that other player belongs to the group referred to, this would amount to a breach of the Anti-Discrimination Code.

3. Any breach of this Code may also constitute an offence or breach of other applicable laws, rules and/or regulations. This Code is intended to supplement such other laws, rules and regulations and is not intended, and may not be interpreted, construed or applied, to prejudice or undermine in any way the application of such other laws, rules and/or regulations. Participants therefore acknowledge and agree that this Code does not limit their responsibilities or obligations under other laws, rules and/or regulations.



# Updating Availability for Matches on the Hutton CC Website

We encourage all members to use the club website to update availability for forthcoming matches.

**New members:** Once your application has been processed, we will send login details to the main email address that you entered on your application form.

**Existing members:** You will have previously received login details. If you cannot remember your login details, please click the "forgot password" link at the top right hand corner instead of "login" and follow the instructions.

1) With your log in details to hand, click "login" in the top right hand corner



2) Enter your login id and password when prompted. If you can't remember these, then click the "forgotten password?" link and enter your email address to reset your password.



3) Once logged in you will be able to browse as either yourself, or your child. To browse the site as your child and update their availability, click the person icon again and then next to "Browse as" select your child from the drop-down list.









4) Next, click the person icon again and select "match availability"



5) You will now be on the availability page and you can set your child's availability for any junior age group match or senior match (if they are in the U13 or older age group). All changes to availability for a game are saved automatically by the website.
