1st XI Captain's Notes



Hello and welcome to the 2024 season!

Thanks to Alex for his captaincy last year. In what was a very tough season for the club, the morale was always high, and we kept competing to the best of our abilities throughout the season. Kegworth is a special club because we all enjoy playing with and for each other, and Alex made sure that was the case right until the last game.

Despite the results last year there were some significant highlights through the season. Gareth Isaac on a tough early season surface against Barrow hit a rapid 85, with him taking more batting responsibility this season, we can be sure to see more entertaining innings. Jordan Holmes took his first 5 wicket haul as an out and out spinner with a delightful 5-8 at Syston. Ben Hogan continues to increase his influence on the team, his classy 78* against a strong Kibworth side showed he will be an important cornerstone in the batting line up in the coming years.

Scott Moore was leading run scorer with 451 runs, nearly twice the amount of the next person. Albert Grieves returned from university mid-season and topped the batting averages at 32.68. Danny Bryans was leading wicket taker with 20, closely followed by Jordan on 19, while Alex Fitchett led the bowling averages at 18.60.

The last game of the season at Leicester Ivanhoe brought a sentimental moment. Despite it being our last game in the top division before relegation, when Scott raised his bat aloft in the 34th over there were smiles throughout the club as he celebrated his first Premier League century.

As we look to the 2024 season, there are a lot of opportunities for a successful summer ahead. We have a strong squad with Premier League experience that will be invaluable in Division 1. Welcome to our overseas player Reinhardt Engler, it will be exciting to see his performances this year, and there will be other new faces to the club as we continue to develop the squad so, please give them a warm welcome as you see them around. I am sure we will be a side that other teams won't expect many points from this season.

KTCC as a whole has continued to develop over the winter and the ground looks fantastic so early in the season. A huge amount of work goes on in the background by club members to keep the operations running smoothly so a special thanks goes out to them. The 2023 season continued to be very competitive in Division 4 West; all sides seemingly capable of beating each other on a given day. The wonderful English weather also played its part with two of the first three league games being called off without a ball being bowled along with two more fixtures falling foul of the weather during what should be the height of summer. Here's hoping for sunnier Saturdays during the 2024 season!

There were some notable performances during the 2023 season. The destructive Danny Simms continued his fine form from 2022 scoring 347 runs, whilst Jon Wall (403 runs - including a superb 123 vs Appleby Magna) formed a fruitful opening partnership with newcomer Mark Richardson (260 runs). I look forward to seeing these performances go from strength to strength and remaining very competitive in the league whilst integrating more junior playing members of the club.

- Junior members are not allowed to smoke on club premises or whilst representing the club at competitions.
- Junior members are not allowed to consume alcohol or drugs of any kind on the club premises or whilst representing the club.

Club Constitution

1. NAME OF THE CLUB

The Club shall be called the 'Kegworth Town Cricket Club'.

2. PURPOSE AND OBJECTS OF THE CLUB

The purpose of the Club is to promote the amateur sport of cricket in Kegworth and the surrounding villages and community participation in the same. The object of the Club shall be to provide good class cricket, to ensure good sportsmanship at all times and to provide social entertainment for its members and affiliated organisations. The Club shall be non-profit making and any surplus income or gains shall be re-invested in the Club. The Club shall not permit any distribution of its assets in cash or in kind to members or third parties. To ensure a duty of care to all members of the Club by adopting and implementing the 'ECB Cricket Equity Policy', 'ECB Safe Hands - Crickets Policy for Safeguarding Children' and 'ECB Anti-Discrimination Code' and any future versions of the policies/code.

3. MEMBERSHIP

The annual subscription shall be the sum as proposed by the Management Committee and adopted by vote in the Annual General Meeting. The Management Committee shall have the powers to abate any subscriptions in exceptional cases, on application or recommendation of an official in writing. Membership is open to all the community, regardless of sex, age, disability, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, religion or other beliefs. The Management Committee may refuse membership, or remove it, only for good cause such as conduct or character likely to bring the Club or sport into disrepute. Appeal against refusal or removal may be made to the Management Committee. There shall be six classes of membership available, these are:

- a) Full Member
- b) Student Member
- c) Family Membership (2 non-playing adults and children)
- d) Social Member
- e) Honorary/Life Member
- f) Vice President Member

4A. MANAGEMENT

The general affairs of the Club shall be managed by a Management Committee consisting of a minimum of eight members, including a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, General Secretary, Treasurer and Club Welfare Officer, elected by members at the Annual General Meeting. The Management Committee shall have the power to co-opt such additional members as they consider desirable for the efficient running of the Club. Four shall form a quorum. The Management Committee shall have the power to form various sub-committees with its own organisers. All sub-committees to report back to the Management Committee and that the Management Committee shall have

the power to overrule any sub-committee decision. Two shall form a quorum in sub-committee. No member of the club who is also a member or on the management committee of another club will be eligible to be elected to the Management Committee.

An Annual General Meeting shall be held not later than April each year and in any event, not more than fifteen months shall elapse without the holding of an Annual General Meeting. An audited balance sheet shall be presented at each Annual General Meeting. A President shall be elected at each Annual General Meeting along with the Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, General Secretary, Treasurer and Management Committee. The terms of the office to be on an annual basis, retiring members shall be eligible for re-election. The Management Committee shall invite persons as they consider suitable to become Vice Presidents of the Club. Upon payment of the membership fee, Vice Presidents may attend and vote at Annual General Meetings.

Captains shall be proposed by the Cricket Sub-Committee and sanctioned by the Management Committee prior to the start of the season. Captains will be officially appointed by the club at the following Annual General Meeting. In exceptional circumstances the Management Committee has the right to appoint Captains without the need for appointment at an Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting.

Members shall be given eight weeks notice of the Annual General Meeting and must submit nominations for the various officers and propositions for the change of constitution, at least four weeks before the Annual General Meeting to the General Secretary. A copy of all nominations and proposals shall be sent to members at least two weeks before the Annual General Meeting.

4B. BAR MANAGEMENT

The Management Committee shall be responsible for the organisation of the bar function. They shall appoint a Bar Manager who shall be responsible for the purchase of intoxicating liquor and other goods for resale and for the keeping of proper books and accounts of stock records. The Bar Manager shall report to the Management Committee. The Management Committee may at their discretion appoint a sub-committee to assist in the day to day running and accountability. No member shall receive any remuneration or commission whatsoever on the purchase or sale of any goods. The Management Committee shall ensure that the Club complies with local licensing laws on force at any time or as ordered by the local licensing authority.

5. GUESTS

- a) The facilities of the Club shall be open to guests who are accompanied by a member provided that no members shall introduce any person who has been refused membership of the Club.
- b) Guests shall be permitted to be supplied with and purchase intoxicating liquor.
- c) Each member introducing a guest(s) shall be responsible for his or her conduct while on Club premises.

6. TEMPORARY MEMBERS

Members of the Club's games teams and their supporters visiting the Club for a games contest, or other party visiting the Club shall be temporary members of the Club for the day of their visit. Temporary members shall not be allowed to attend General Meetings, vote at elections, be nominated as candidates for committees of other offices, or introduce visitors.

7. SUBSCRIPTIONS

All subscriptions shall be due on the 1st April each year and must be paid by 1st June. No member shall be allowed to use the property of the Club or be eligible for selection whose subscription remains unpaid after 1st June. The Management Committee shall have the powers to offer a variety of payment options on an annual basis for subscriptions.

8. SELECTION

All teams shall be chosen by appointed captains or a nominated representative of each team on a weekly basis.

9. DISCIPLINE & APPEALS

All complaints regarding the behaviour of members should be lodged in writing with the General Secretary. If in the opinion of the Management Committee any member shall be found to be unfit or improper persons and that their actions be injurious in any shape or form to the Club, they shall be liable to expulsion by the Management Committee. Appeal against such a decision may be made to the Management Committee and decided by a majority vote.

10. SPECIAL GENERAL MEETING

A special meeting may be convened if, in the opinion of the Management Committee it should be considered necessary or if called by thirty or more members or one fifth of the total number of members, whichever be the less. The rules of the Club may be altered or amended at any Annual General Meeting or Special General Meeting, but in the case of emergency, the Management Committee shall have the power to amend rules.

11. CLUB CONSTITUTION

- a) A copy of the current Club Constitution shall be exhibited at all times in the Club premises.
- b) The Club shall accept no responsibility for the injury or loss sustained by members or their guests nor for loss or damage to property of members or their guests.

12. SOCIAL MEMBERS

Subject as herein after provided in this rule, persons may be admitted as social members of the Club and intoxicating liquor may be sold to them by and on behalf of the Club for consumption on the premises. Admission to the Club as a social member shall be in accordance with the rules of the Club as they refer to admission of ordinary members. Social members shall have the same rights and privileges and be subject to the same rules as ordinary members except that they must not vote at any meeting of the Club. The Management Committee may refuse admission to social members or limit their admission to such times and parts of the Club premises as think fit in the interests of the Club.

13. AFFILIATIONS

Other social organisations may be affiliated to the Club by representation to the Management Committee who shall agree individual terms. Such organisations shall be bound by procedures and instructions laid down by the Management Committee and given in writing to each organisation.

Affiliated organisations shall provide the Club with a copy of their own rules and a list of its members, which must be maintained up to date. No voting rights are available to affiliates and the Management Committee shall have the right to limit or expel affiliations without notice.

14. DISSOLUTION

- a) The members may vote to wind up the Club if not less than three quarters of those present and voting support that proposal at a properly convened General Meeting.
- b) The Committee will then be responsible for the orderly winding up of the Club's affairs.
- c) After settling all liabilities of the Club, the Committee shall dispose of the net assets remaining to one or more of the following:
 - i) To another Club with similar sports purposes which is a registered charity and/or
 - ii) To another Club with similar sports purposes which is a registered CASC and/or
 - iii) To the Club's governing body for use by them for related community sports.



Code of Conduct for Cricket Club Members and Guests

PLAYERS & MEMBERS

Our Codes of Conduct require the highest standards of conduct from everyone involved in cricket to ensure that their behaviour and actions meet the values and standards expected at all times.

Everyone must conduct themselves in an honest, fair, impartial and transparent manner.

I will respect:

- The rules, regulations and requirements of the Sport, including, but not limited to, any Competitions in which I participate either directly or indirectly.
- The rights, dignity and worth of all people involved in cricket, regardless of any protected characteristic (age, disability, gender reassignment, marriage and civil partnership, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or belief, sex, and sexual orientation).
- The rights, dignity and worth of Children, Young People and Adults at Risk and ensure that I am aware of the Safeguarding best practice guidelines and procedures when interacting with them.
- Confidentiality and the sensitivities of information I hold on other individuals.
- Cricket and the individual's reputation and not take any action or make inappropriate comments, including on social media, about a fellow participant, coach, official, volunteer or member of ECB staff that will bring the Sport or those associated with delivering the Sport into disrepute*. I will respect ECBs guidance and policies on Social Media technology.
- The position I hold within cricket and always conduct and dress myself in an appropriate manner.
- The result of the game and will not attempt to offer or accept either directly or indirectly any consideration whatsoever in return for influencing or attempting to influence the result. I will not seek to achieve personal gain on a result which I can influence by betting on any match or event where I am participating, either by playing, coaching or officiating, or through direct or indirect involvement.
- On match day, all matters relating to team management, coaching and team planning are the responsibility of the team manager and coach.



Code of Conduct for Cricket Club Members and Guests

I will:

- Not abuse or misuse any relationship of trust or position of power or influence held by me in my team, be that my playing team, Club, County, or England Cricket.
- Be on time, dressed appropriately and ready to give my full attention to the role I am carrying out within cricket.
- Recognise that individuals bring different qualities and attributes.
- Welcome new members, volunteers, and connected participation and cooperate with Members, Connected Participants, colleagues, coaches, officials and administrators already in the Sport.
- Recognise the achievements of others and applaud their performance and not just the result.
- Endeavor to ensure that all involved in the Sport optimise their potential by promoting the positive aspects of the sport and never condoning the use of inappropriate or abusive language, inappropriate relationships, bullying, harassment, discrimination, or physical violence.
- Discourage unfair play and arguing with officials.
- Welcome visiting teams and their supporters.
- Never engage in discriminatory abuse or anti-social behaviour which could include but is not limited to racism, sexism, antisemitic, Islamophobic, homophobic or transphobic behaviour.
- Not impinge on others enjoyment of the Sport or my performance by consuming alcoholic drinks, smoke or vape immediately prior to or while participating in the sport, or while safeguarding children, young people, or vulnerable adults.
- Ensure that everyone has the opportunity to participate in a fair, honest environment by rejecting cheating, abiding by the Anti-Doping policies and not taking illegal substances immediately prior to or while participating in the Sport.
- Display modesty in victory and graciousness in defeat; be sporting – whether I win or lose; always acknowledge the other team and the umpires at the end of the game with a hand shake or three cheers.
- Never argue with an official or participant during a game and listen to and cooperate with officials' decisions.
- Respect the scorers at all times and not approach them at any time.
- Control my temper; I understand that verbal, emotional and physical abuse of officials, coaches, spectators, or participants, or deliberately distracting or provoking a participant, coach or official is not acceptable or permitted behaviour in cricket.
- Enjoy the game and ensure other can also enjoy it. I will endeavour to abide by this code of conduct and promote it to others. I understand that if I fail to follow the code, the ECB Cricket, the County Association may take action against me under the Disciplinary Regulations which may result in Sanctions including suspension.
- Make myself aware of the clubs two Welfare officers.



Code of Conduct for Cricket Club Members and Guests

PARENTS & CARERS

The enjoyment and safety of your child when involved in a cricket activity is of paramount importance to England Cricket.

Every child will be encouraged and asked to ensure that their behaviour and actions meet the values and standards expected of them at all times.

As parents, you are asked to support our Codes of Conduct and embrace the spirit of our game.

Once at the venue, please keep your distance from the squad changing/viewing area. If for any reason you need to talk to your son/daughter, then please liaise with the coach/manager.

Please refrain from approaching the boundary edge to coach or converse with players from either side. Feel free to clap/encourage positively from your viewing distance.

We would appreciate it if the players do not use phones/electronic devices during the hours of play, but rather encourage and support their team mates on the field of play.

The coach/manager will be contactable at all times.

I will:

- Encourage my child to play within the rules and respect officials' and coaches' decisions.
- Support my child's efforts and performance, give positive comments that motivate and encourage continued effort and learning.
- Understand that Competition is about winning and losing, so results are always accepted without undue disappointment.
- Be a positive role model to my child by helping them work towards skill improvement and good sportsmanship.
- Remember that children learn best by example; I will applaud good play by both my child's team and their opponents.
- Thank the coaches, officials and other volunteers who give their time for my child and not interfere with their decisions.
- Help when asked by a coach or official.
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of all people involved in the game, regardless of gender, marital status, race, colour, disability, sexuality, age, occupation, religion or political opinion.

Code of Conduct for Cricket Club Members and Guests

- Never engage in discriminatory abuse or anti-social behaviour which could include but is not limited to racism, sexism, antisemitic, Islamophobic, homophobic or transphobic behaviour.
- Read the rules of the Sport to understand better what I am watching and discussing with my child.
- Promote this code of conduct to other parents, carers and supporters.
- Be aware of my child's club safeguarding policy and ensure that any concerns are reported to the club's safeguarding officer or ECB's Lead Safeguarding Officer.

I will not:

- Pressure my child in any way; I know that this is their Sport not mine.
- Use inappropriate language, harass athletes, coaches, officials or other spectators.
- Criticise or ridicule my child for making a mistake or losing after the game.
- Force my child if they are unwilling to participate in the Sport.
- Use social media technology to bring the game into disrepute or make an inappropriate comment about an athlete, coach, official, volunteer or member of England Cricket staff.
