Chain of Command and Procedures

For incidents that require first aid, the umpire or coach decides whether to stop the match/training session

The umpire/coach summons a first aider or medic if available who will take charge and make an initial assessment using ABCDE approach and decide whether to call the emergency services or not.

If emergency services are required, an adult will be sent to call 999 and to report back that they have done so.

If required, an adult will be sent to collect the defibrillator

An adult will be sent to the roundabout at the entrance to the ground to direct the emergency services.

Another adult will be sent to the kitchenette to get the gate key, to then open the gate and remain there to direct the ambulance onto the ground. If the emergency is in the clubhouse, they will be sent to the top of the stairs leading to the clubhouse entrance to direct the emergency services.

An adult will control bystanders moving them to another part of the club and support concerned players/family members.

A family member must accompany a junior to hospital.

Following the incident an injury/accident form must be complete by the first aider/medic who took charge of the incident. It maybe necessary to hold a debriefing session and for a review of the MEAP to be held.

Following the incident, a club official will be deputed to contact the casualty or a family member if more appropriate.

Other Relevant Information

This document is to be made available to all team managers and coaches. A copy is kept in the club handbook which is kept behind the bar on lounge bar side.

Jayne Freeman and Rachel Firth are responsible for restocking first aid boxes and maintaining the defibrillator.
