A Change in Fortune as we go

UNBEATEN TEROUGEOUT JULY

AFTER going throughout June with just one victory in ten games (seven lost) Arkley went through July's five games without defeat by drawing the first two games and then winning three in a row.

The first game saw at home, at Brunswick Park for the second time, against

Northmet who won the toss, batted and scored 170-5dec including an opening stand of 121 by Derek Penny (76) and Ernie Johnson (53). Both were dismissed by the combination of Clive Townsend & Jon Davies with Jon finishing with 3-28, his career best bowling for Arkley. This game marked the return of Mark Cripps to the team but due to a back injury he was not able to bowl flat out. From 32-3 Arkley reached 122-6 in reply including Clive Townsend's first half century of the season. The following weekend should have been the Cornwall Tour but as that was not possible this year we arranged a friendly game with New Southgate Social, again at Brunswick Park. New Southgate Social totalled 163-9dec after at one stage being 87-7 and in reply a stand of 85 by Clive Townsend (42) and Mark Cripps (52) was the only one of note as no other Arkley player scored more than 4! Bob Ingram & Paul Townsend held out the last two overs at 116-7 for the draw.

Defending a modest total of 108 v. Bentley Heath II we dismissed the opposition for 97 (Bob Ingram 5-25, Sharma 4-14) to record our first victory since 8th June with 9 'winless' games between the two victories. John Griffiths top scored with 36 despite being cut just below the eye by a sharply rising ball off a length! causing him to retire hurt for a while. John's 36 came in 38 minutes including 6 fours and he also took the match winning catch.

The next day we almost defeated Agricola by 10 wickets. Having dismissed Agricola for 95, with Colin Brown claiming his first wickets for the club, Clive Townsend (55) and Sharma (33) took Arkley to within 10 runs of victory with an opening stand of 86. The victory margin being eight wickets Flushed with success from these two victories and on a good batting wicket at Lyttleton Playing Fields the following week Arkley scored 180-7dec with successive stands of 70+ involving Peter Brown (59), Clive Townsend (30) and Mark Cripps (42). Crosskeys in reply were dismissed for 95 with Bob Ingram returning the seasons best bowling figures (by one run) of 7-43 and nine of the wickets falling to catches (what went wrong!).
